If you're considering a greater role in Ohio's travel industry or wish to understand how tourism operates at the state level, the Ohio Tourism Leadership Academy is the perfect opportunity for you. This innovative program connects you with industry peers who are trailblazers in their field, introduces key industry challenges and opportunities in a manner that fosters creative solutions, and provides a foundational understanding of what it means to be a leader in Ohio.

Upon graduation, you'll possess the networks, knowledge, and confidence needed to serve more effectively on regional and state boards and to become a more active voice in legislative matters.

Program Details

The Ohio Tourism Leadership Academy builds leaders by fostering knowledge, developing leadership skills, strengthening networks and informing participants about the responsibilities of boardmanship. The program consists of six classes with session locations taking place in the Greater Columbus area. Each session begins at 10 a.m. and concludes at 3 p.m.

During the sessions, you will be introduced to critical regional and statewide tourism issues. You will meet and discuss issues with leaders from statewide public, private and non-profit related agencies. Through panel discussions, round tables, presentations, tours and other activities, the Ohio Tourism Leadership Academy will build a stronger Ohio by forging stronger leaders within the travel industry.

Candidate Selection

Participants are selected in an objective process and must be recommended and sponsored by their employers, generally by the chief executive officer. Self-employed persons may sponsor themselves. Sponsorship may also be made by non-profit organizations. Candidates will be sought who have high energy and passion for the tourism industry. They should be articulate, available to commit and able to demonstrate a willingness to learn new skills and put them into action after graduation.

Participation in the sessions represents a significant commitment of time and dedication on the part of those chosen for the program. They will be required to attend all sessions to graduate unless absence is excused by the Ohio Tourism Leadership Academy organizers.

Applicants should be aware that there may be more nominees than class size permits. Candidates are selected exclusively on their own merits.

Dec. 12, 2025

Completed applications for the 2026 program must be received by the Ohio Travel Association by Dec. 12, 2025. Applicants will be notified of their selection by Dec. 19, 2025

Tuition

Tuition for the 2026 program is \$935 for current OTA members and \$1,010 for non-members. Tuition fees are established to cover the cost of materials, supplementary data, meals and administration of the program. Non-member rates also include one-year OTA membership. Tuition does not include conference registration.
